Travel, parking and registration info

Goshen College campus is located at 1700 S. Main St. in Goshen, IN. For driving directions, a campus map and other information, see <http://www.goshen.edu/aboutgc/map.php>

All events will be held in the church-chapel building, #13 on the map.

Best parking is in the large visitor lot just south of the church-chapel.

Registration begins at 4:00 p.m. and will continue until 9:00 p.m. The first session begins at 7:00.
