Voices of the Earth

Voices of the Earth, a treble choir established at Goshen College in 2005 by the late Dr. Debra Detwiler, is open to Goshen College student treble voices of all years and majors. Originally named the Women's World Music Choir, it continues to honor music historically underrepresented in the academy, explore what it means to be in right relationship with artistic partners, and seek mutually beneficial, shared connection through musical expression. The choir highlights the role of womxn, celebrating the unique spirit, faith, and energy that womxn bring to the world as creators and sustainers of life and art. Voices of the Earth performed at the ACDA Central Division in 2008 and has appeared at local festivals, including North Manchester's Sing Me Home Festival in 2023 and ASHE: A Community of Voices hosted by South Bend's UZIMA! Dance and Drum Company in 2024. Since 2017, Voices of the Earth has hosted the annual Goshen College High Voice Choir Festival.

Note from the director

The realities of contemporary life are significant, with little agreement about solutions. This concert is born from the idea that insisting on the power of social imagination in the face of challenges is critical. Our capacity for imagination is boundless, and just because we have not experienced something does not mean it is not possible. Melissa Dunphy's song, "New Dreams," inspired by the work of Detroit activist Grace Lee Boggs, states "New Dreams are born in questions. How do we transform ourselves? How do we transform our world? What do we need? What do we want? What is the difference?" This song is in conversation with "The Beauty of Your Dreams" by Joan Szymko, who sets Eleanor Roosevelt's text "You must do the thing you think you cannot do" as well as Bernice Johnson Reagon's setting of Ella Baker's words, "We who believe in freedom cannot rest" and Lea Morris's call to "Honor the dark as we do the light." We hope you feel drawn into the music, empowered to value your perspective, consider others' perspectives, and fiercely harness the boundless power of imagination in addressing the contemporary challenges of being in community. Thank you for joining us in this concert experience, and in the words of the final song, "The Parting Glass," may joy be with you.

H. Roz Woll, DMA, is an Assistant Professor of Music at Goshen College, where she teaches voice and directs the choir, Voices of the Earth. She recently moved from New York City, where she taught voice, and vocal pedagogy, and directed the Women's Choir at Queens College, City University of New York. Prior to living in New York, she was a conductor with the Chicago Children's Choir for nine years, directing the Hyde Park Neighborhood Choir and choirs in ten Chicago public schools. As a singer, she has played Dinah (Trouble in Tahiti), Lucretia (The Rape of Lucretia), Grace (Roman Fever), the Announcer (Gallantry), Florence Pike (Albert Herring), Viola (L'infedeltà fedele), Dame Doleful (Too Many Sopranos), and Nancy (Oliver). With Downtown Music Productions she has appeared in Honoring Langston Hughes, and Yom Hashoah: Holocaust Remembrance Program, and with Music in Midtown she appeared in American Spirituals, featuring the music of Roy Jennings, and in The Songs of Richard Hundley – A Celebration. She has been a professional member of the Chicago Symphony Chorus and the Grant Park Symphony Chorus and has been a community member of the Cathedral Choir at Abyssinian Baptist Church and the gospel group, Choral Thunder. She received her Bachelor of Music Education with a concentration in piano at Indiana University and her Master of Music in vocal performance from Roosevelt University's Chicago College of Performing Arts. She recently finished her Doctorate in Musical Arts at the CUNY Graduate Center with a certification in Africana Studies, where her dissertation won a Barry S. Brook award. Her research interests address connections between arts education, the political economy of race, and global citizenship.

Marcia Yost is currently serving as the Goshen College Director of the Arts. In this capacity, she is the tour coordinator for all Goshen College music ensembles. Marcia is retired from a 40-year career in public school music education, where her passion for music helped build a highly recognized music education program for the Goshen Community Schools. Her current position at Goshen College includes visioning for the arts programs at Goshen College and working toward further engagement and outreach through these programs. Her work includes helping to establish Elkhart County and Goshen College as a hub for "Music for Social Change" and widening Goshen College's footprint in the arts community throughout the state. Ms. Yost is also a sought-after choral clinician, adjudicator and speaker. She has conducted choral ensembles of all ages and backgrounds. Ms. Yost holds a Bachelor's Degree in Music Education from the University of Indianapolis and an M.M in Choral Conducting and Music History from Western Michigan University. Marcia is a lifelong Goshen resident who is proud of how the arts flourish in our community.

The Goshen College Music Department

The Goshen College Music Department offers a bachelor of arts degree with concentrations in music education, performance, piano pedagogy and music for social change. Two new courses of musical study added to the department's offerings are a minor in musical theater and a minor in music for social change. More than 70 students major or minor in music and enjoy participation in three choirs, a touring worship ensemble, staged musicals and operas, symphony orchestra and jazz band. The music department offers scholarships ranging from \$1,000 to \$10,000 per year.

The music department is housed in the Goshen College Music Center, built in 2001. The Music Center features the 1,000-seat Sauder Concert Hall, the 250-seat Rieth Recital Hall, rehearsal and practice rooms, classrooms, teaching studios, a recording studio and an art gallery. The Community School of the Arts, located in the Music Center, provides teaching experience and leadership training for Goshen College students. The Performing Arts Series regularly brings prominent national and international musicians to the Music Center.
