To verify that you provided correct information the financial aid administrator at Goshen College will compare your FAFSA with the information on this worksheet and with any other required documents. If there are differences, your FAFSA information may need to be corrected. You must complete and sign this worksheet, attach any required documents, and submit the form and other required documents to the financial aid administrator at your school. Your school may ask for additional information. If you have questions about verification, contact us as soon as possible so your financial aid will not be delayed.

### High School Completion Status

Provide one of the following documents that indicate the student’s high school completion status when the student will begin college in 2021–2022:

- ◆ A copy of the student’s high school diploma.
- ◆ A copy of the student’s final official high school transcript that shows the date when the diploma was awarded.
- ◆ An academic transcript that indicates the student successfully completed at least a two-year program that is acceptable for full credit toward a bachelor’s degree.
- ◆ If State law requires a homeschooled student to obtain a secondary school completion credential for homeschool (other than a high school diploma or its recognized equivalent), a copy of that credential.
- ◆ If State law does not require a homeschooled student to obtain a secondary school completion credential for homeschool (other than a high school diploma or its recognized equivalent), a transcript or the equivalent, signed by the student’s parent or guardian, that lists the secondary school courses the student completed and documents the successful completion of a secondary school education in a homeschool setting.

If the student is unable to obtain the documentation listed above, he or she must contact the financial aid office.

### Identity and Statement of Educational Purpose (To Be Signed at the Institution)

**YOU MUST APPEAR IN PERSON AT GOSHEN COLLEGE** to verify your identity by presenting a valid government-issued photo identification (ID), such as, but not limited to, a driver’s license, other state-issued ID, or passport. Goshen College will maintain a copy of the student’s photo ID that is annotated with the date it was received and the name of the official at the institution authorized to collect the student’s ID.

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**Receipt of SNAP Benefits**

- ♦ A copy of the separation agreement or divorce decree that shows the amount of child support to be provided;
- ♦ A signed statement from the individual receiving the child support certifying the amount of child support received; or
- ♦ Copies of the child support payment checks, money order receipts, or similar records of electronic payments having been made.
