John Paul Lederach

Dr. John Paul Lederach is founding director of the Conflict Transformation Program at the Institute for Justice and Peacebuilding at Eastern Mennonite University, Harrisonburg, Va. The professor of sociology and conflict studies is recognized internationally in the field of conciliation and mediation, having consulted or participated in negotiations in Nicaragua, Somalia, Northern Ireland, the Basque Country, Colombia, Quebec and the Philippines and developed and led mediation training programs in more than 25 countries. A September 2000 Associated Press story out of Jakarta, Indonesia, reported Lederach's belief that truth, justice, mercy and peace are the four concepts most important in situations that cry for reconciliation.

Lederach's pioneering theories of conflict resolution have been quoted in the *Jerusalem Post*, *Belfast Telegraph*, *Christian Science Monitor*, *Sojourners*, *Toronto Star*, *Conrad Grebel Review*, *International Journal of Nonviolence* and *Christianity Today*. He has led courses related to peace and conflict studies at Bethel College in Newton, Kan., Associated Mennonite Biblical Seminary in Elkhart, Ind., Oxford University, Syracuse University and schools in Spain, Central America, Colombia and Guatemala.

Dr. Lederach has written nine books, in English and Spanish, and most recently co-edited *From The Ground Up: Mennonite Contributions to International Peacebuilding* with Cynthia Sampson. One critic termed the book "an essential resource for students and scholars of religion, diplomacy and peacemaking."

Lederach graduated from Bethel College, Newton, Kan., in 1980 and received a doctorate degree in sociology with a social conflict concentration from the University of Colorado in 1988. He directed Mennonite Central Committee's International Conciliation Service and has served MCC terms in Central America and Belgium and a Mennonite Board of Missions term in Spain.

Honors Program

The vision for honors study at Goshen College is broad and inclusive rather than prescribed and elitist. It promotes collaboration as well as individual achievement and celebrates a wide variety of talents and gifts.

The following criteria must be met if students apply to earn a degree "with honors:" completing two or more honors seminars, presenting work at an academic symposium, participating in 40 or more hours of community service and writing a senior thesis.

Nursing Honors

Sigma Theta Tau International endeavors to seek out and reward all students in baccalaureate or higher degree nursing programs who have demonstrated ability in nursing as evidenced by superior academic achievement. Honors nursing students wear a cord on their commencement gown.

The academic procession

The history of academic dress reaches back into the earliest days of the oldest universities. The costumes and colors, trimmings and patterns you will see are all traditional and interpret both the degree and field of learning. The bachelor's gown has pointed sleeves; the master's gown has an oblong sleeve. The doctor's gown has bell-shaped sleeves decorated with chevrons of velvet.

The colors you will see in the hoods and gowns of GC faculty represent the various fields in which the degrees were taken: apricot – nursing, brown – fine arts, citron – social work, crimson – journalism; dark blue – philosophy, yellow – science, green – medicine, lemon yellow – library science, blue – education, pink – music, purple – law, sage green – physical education, salmon pink – public health, scarlet – theology, brown – business, white – arts and humanities.

The hoods, differing in length for the three degrees, are lined with the official colors of the university or college conferring the degree. Hoods are edged and bound with velvet of the color appropriate for the degree.



The lamp and the book

In 1904 "Culture for Service" was announced officially as the motto of Goshen College, first spoken by President N.E. Byers in the closing words of his inaugural address. There was a traditional graduation week ceremony carried out, at least by the early 1920s, in which the graduating senior class solemnly passed the actual emblems of the book and lamp to the juniors. Found in the college seal, the book serves as a double symbol for an institution where there is importance attached to the written word and especially the privileged place of holy Scripture. The lighted Grecian lamp represents the light that comes from learning. In a world of darkness, the light pushes back the darkness – to know, to see, to discover truth. GC is a place of light and of enlightenment.
