

Daniel Charles

Commencement Speaker



Dan Charles is a food and agriculture correspondent for National Public Radio (NPR), where he reports on the culture, business and science behind food. His passion for storytelling has led him to report on stories involving mosquitos, digital maps, sugar beets and fixed-gear bikes.

Before working at NPR, Charles was an independent radio producer and writer. He has contributed articles on technology, public health, environment and education to magazines including *National Geographic*, *New Scientist*, *Science*, *The Christian Science Monitor*, the *Washington Post*, *Technology Review* and other publications.

In 2009-10, Charles taught journalism in Ukraine through the Fulbright program. He is the author of two books: *Master Mind: The rise and fall of Fritz Haber, the Nobel laureate who launched the era of chemical warfare*, published in 2005. He also wrote *Lords of the Harvest: Biotech, Big Money, and the Future of Food* (Perseus, 2001), a widely praised account of how genetically engineered crops came to be, and how they became controversial.

Charles grew up in a rural Mennonite community near Lancaster, Pa. He received a bachelor's degree in economics and international affairs from American University in 1982. Charles has studied in Bonn, Germany, and was a Knight Science Journalism fellow at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

He lives in Washington, D.C. with his wife and two daughters, where they attend Community House Church.

The Lamp and the Book



Goshen College is a place of light and of enlightenment. The college seal incorporates the official motto, a lamp and a book. In 1904, "Culture for Service" was made the motto of Goshen College after the term was used by the college's first president Noah E. Byers in his 1903 inaugural address. The book symbolizes the importance of the written word, especially holy Scripture. The lighted lamp represents the light of learning that, in a world of darkness, pushes back the darkness.

The actual lamp and book used to be passed from the graduating senior class to the junior class in a ceremony. Now, graduates sign the book after receiving their degrees in a tradition that links generations of alumni in the spirit of "Culture for Service" and extends the light of learning to future students.

The Academic Procession

The history of academic dress reaches back into the earliest days of the oldest universities. The costumes and colors, trimmings and patterns you will see are all traditional and interpret both the degree and field of learning. The bachelor's gown has pointed sleeves; the master's gown has an oblong sleeve. The doctor's gown has bell-shaped sleeves decorated with chevrons of velvet.

The hoods, differing in length for the three degrees, are lined with the official colors of the university or college conferring the degree. Hoods are edged and bound with velvet of the color appropriate for the degree.

The colors you will see in the hoods and gowns of Goshen College faculty represent the various fields in which the degrees were taken:

apricot – nursing
brown – fine arts
citron – social work
crimson – journalism
dark blue – philosophy
yellow – science
green – medicine
lemon yellow – library science
blue – education
pink – music
purple – law
sage green – physical education
salmon pink – public health
scarlet – theology
brown – business
white – arts and humanities
orange – engineering

Graduate Pledge

Some graduates are wearing a green ribbon on their gowns today signifying that they have signed a pledge that reads, "I pledge to explore and take into account the social and environmental consequences of any job I consider and will try to improve these aspects of any organizations for which I work." This pledge is being taken on over 100 campuses across the country this spring and encourages graduates to be intentional and responsible about their employment.

Degrees

Goshen College confers two graduate education degrees: the Master of Arts Degree in Environmental Education and the Master of Science Degree in Nursing.

Two baccalaureate degrees are conferred. Those with majors in Nursing or Organizational Leadership receive the Bachelor of Science degree. All others receive the Bachelor of Arts degree.

Following each name is the field of study being completed by the student. Use of the diagonal (/) indicates that the two fields are a double major program with two equal areas of concentration. Areas in which a minor will be completed are indicated by *italics*. Secondary Education certification is listed in parentheses. Interdisciplinary concentrations are listed after the colon.

Graduation Honors

Graduation honors are awarded to undergraduate students who have earned a cumulative GPA of 3.6 or above with no grade lower than a “C” at Goshen College. Students in the traditional baccalaureate degree program must have completed a minimum of 48 graded hours at Goshen College. Students in the Adult Degree Completion Program must have completed at least 40 graded hours at Goshen College. Honors are reflective of grade point averages as of December 2012 and are subject to change with the addition of grades in later terms. The specific honor is indicated with an asterisk after the name.
