

# Joyce Bontrager Lehman

## Commencement Speaker



Joyce Bontrager Lehman has worked in international economic development for the past 15 years, currently as an independent technical advisor to donor organizations that fund projects with a focus on financial inclusion. She is particularly interested in how technology, especially the ubiquitous mobile phone, can be used to provide impoverished people in developing countries access to convenient and affordable formal financial services. In the past few years, she has worked with the Aga Khan Foundation, the MasterCard Foundation, the United Nations Capital Development Fund, the United States Agency for International Development and the World Bank.

From 2008 to 2012, Bontrager Lehman was a program officer on the Financial Services for the Poor team at the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation in Seattle. There she managed a \$100 million grant portfolio that funded projects throughout the developing world, including funding to support the establishment of national mobile payment platforms in Bangladesh and Pakistan.

Bontrager Lehman began her career in international development with the Mennonite Economic Development Associates (MEDA), providing training and consulting services to microfinance institutions in more than 25 countries and serving as a faculty member at leading microfinance training institutes held in the United States, Europe and South Africa. From 2003 to 2007, she spent most of her time in Afghanistan working with the World Bank, USAID and other bi-lateral donors to help establish and support a microfinance sector there.

Prior to joining MEDA, Bontrager Lehman was in private practice as a Certified Public Accountant and for two years (1997-1999) taught business courses at Goshen College. She now refers to her years at Goshen as an important time of transition from a career in private practice to her current profession.

A 1965 graduate of Eastern Mennonite University, Bontrager Lehman lives in Keene, N.H., and attends the Mennonite Congregation of Boston.

# The Lamp and the Book



Goshen College is a place of light and of enlightenment. The college seal incorporates the official motto, a lamp and a book. In 1904, "Culture for Service" was made the motto of Goshen College after the term was used by the college's first president, Noah E. Byers, in his 1903 inaugural address. The book symbolizes the importance of the written word, especially holy Scripture. The lighted lamp represents the light of learning that, in a world of darkness, pushes back the darkness.

The actual lamp and book used to be passed from the graduating senior class to the junior class in a ceremony. Now, graduates sign the book after receiving their degrees in a tradition that links generations of alumni in the spirit of "Culture for Service" and extends the light of learning to future students.

# The Academic Procession

The history of academic dress reaches back into the earliest days of the oldest universities. The costumes and colors, trimmings and patterns you will see are all traditional and interpret both the degree and field of learning. The bachelor's gown has pointed sleeves; the master's gown has an oblong sleeve. The doctor's gown has bell-shaped sleeves decorated with chevrons of velvet.

The hoods, differing in length for the three degrees, are lined with the official colors of the university or college conferring the degree. Hoods are edged and bound with velvet of the color appropriate for the degree.

The colors you will see in the hoods and gowns of Goshen College faculty represent the various fields in which the degrees were taken:

## Degrees

Goshen College confers two graduate education degrees: the Master of Arts Degree in Environmental Education and the Master of Science Degree in Nursing.

Two baccalaureate degrees are conferred. Those with majors in Nursing, Organizational Leadership or Business Administration receive the Bachelor of Science degree. All others receive the Bachelor of Arts degree.

Following each name is the field of study being completed by the student. Use of the diagonal (/) indicates that the two fields are a double major program with two equal areas of concentration. Areas in which a minor will be completed are indicated by *italics*. Secondary Education certification is listed in parentheses. Interdisciplinary concentrations are listed after the colon.

## Graduation Honors

Graduation honors are awarded to undergraduate students who have earned a cumulative GPA of 3.6 or above with no grade lower than a "C" at Goshen College. Students in the traditional baccalaureate degree program must have completed a minimum of 48 graded hours at Goshen College. Students in the Adult Degree Completion Program must have completed at least 40 graded hours at Goshen College. Honors are reflective of grade point averages as of December 2013 and are subject to change with the addition of grades in later terms. The specific honor is indicated with an asterisk after the name.
