Student Life will contact the student's Emergency Contact person(s) for additional care plan. 	 If the employee reports health-related symptoms (fever, cough, difficulty breathing) Employee contacts their primary health care provider for an evaluation Employee establishes contact with Jodi Beyeler (574) 535-7572 and their supervisor to update them on their current health status, and start taking sick leave. If employee's symptoms are severe they should contact their local hospital before going to the ER.
 Student should follow all protocols based on provider's diagnosis Student should self quarantine at home and cooperate with their local county health department investigation officials for contact tracing. If the student's illness is presumed to be COVID-19 and they were recently on campus (within 14 days) they should notify Chad Coleman, Director of Student Life Operations and Campus Safety, at 574-535-7599. 	 Student should follow all protocols based on provider's diagnosis RLC begins 24-Hour-monitoring of the student with regular check-ins from staff via phone/text and temp checks. Goshen College reserves the right to engage emergency services based on progression of symptoms. Pending diagnosis, the Crisis Management Team will cooperate with Elkhart County Health Department investigators for further contact tracing and communication with close contacts on campus. The Crisis Management Team will make a determination regarding HIPAA compliant communication to campus that a student has contracted COVID-19 and being quarantined on campus or at the hospital. 	 Employee should follow all protocols based on provider's diagnosis Employee, if able, should communicate with HR and their supervisor with an update on their current health condition HR will verify with employee whether or not they were tested for COVID-19, and its pending results Pending diagnosis, the Crisis Management Team will cooperate with Elkhart County Health Department investigation officials for further contact tracing and communication with close contacts on campus. Crisis Management Team will make determination regarding communication to the broader campus that an employee has contracted COVID-19 and being quarantined in their home or at the hospital.
Disinfecting Plan Enabled: Recommend clean and disinfect your home based on CDC protocol. Close off areas used by the sick person. (including restrooms) Open outside doors and windows to increase air circulation in the area. Wait 24 hours (or as long as possible) before cleaning or disinfecting. Clean and disinfect all areas used by the sick person, such as bathrooms, and common areas, Recovery Plan: Student should remain at home in quarantine (minimum 14 days) until being symptom free and fever free for three consecutive days—even if they feel fine.	Disinfecting Plan Enabled: Custodial staff will clean and disinfect spaces based on CDC protocol. Close off areas used by the sick person. (i.e. Laundry, restrooms) Open outside doors and windows to increase air circulation in the area. Wait 24 hours (or as long as possible) before cleaning or disinfecting. Clean and disinfect all areas used by the sick person, such as bathrooms, and common areas, Recovery Plan: Student remains in quarantine in campus housing (minimum 14 days) until being symptom free and fever free for three consecutive days—even if they feel fine.	Disinfecting Plan Enabled: Close off areas used by the impacted employee. (i.e. classrooms, offices, conference rooms) Open outside doors and windows to increase air circulation in the area. Wait 24 hours (or as long as possible) before cleaning or disinfecting Clean and disinfect all areas used by the sick person, such as bathrooms, and common areas Recovery Plan: Employee should remain home in quarantine (minimum 14 days) until being symptom free and fever free for three consecutive days—even if they feel fine. Employee will produce medical clearance from their care provider before attempting to come back to work.
